

Victoria Falls & Chobe National Park

If visiting the falls you can easily include a stay in nearby Chobe for a short safari



Day 1-2

Take one of the regular daily flights from Johannesburg to Livingstone in Zambia. On arrival you will be met and transferred, by road, to your hotel or lodge for your 2-night stay.

There are plenty of different ways to see the Falls – on a guided walking tour; a cruise on the Zambezi; or in a light aircraft. This area is also well known as an activity centre – white-water rafting; microlighting; bungee jumping; river boarding; tandem kayaking; abseiling; and finally the gorge swing! Also horse trails, elephant back safaris, traditional vehicle safaris, river cruises, cultural tours and shopping trips are all available.

Day 3-4

This morning you will be collected and transferred, by road (approx. 2 hours) or by a combination of road & light aircraft to your chosen safari lodge.



You could also combine Victoria Falls with a visit to the Okavango Delta in Botswana; Botswana can be easily twinned with South Africa or Namibia with direct flights onward to Cape Town, Johannesburg & Windhoek.

Chobe Game Lodge is the only permanent game lodge within Chobe National Park and is set on the banks of the perennial Chobe River, overlooking the fertile floodplains of Namibia. Savute Safari Lodge offers an exclusive safari experience in the renowned Savute area of Chobe National Park, with excellent game viewing year round. Both lodges are part of the Desert & Delta Safaris portfolio.

Chobe is famed for its huge elephant population but also offers excellent all round game viewing. Game drives are undertaken in open safari vehicles, on foot or by boat. There is no substitute to waking up in the African bush.

Day 5

After a final game activity you will head back to Livingstone or Maun airport for your return flight to Johannesburg.
