## Day 10-13

Today you will return to Windhoek and board a flight to Maun in Botswana, the gateway to your 4-night Desert & Delta safari. Transferring by light aircraft you will combine 2 nights in the Okavango Delta with 2 nights in the Savute area of Chobe National Park, a perfect combination for a variety of game viewing.

## Day 14-15

Transfer to Kasane today where you will be collected and taken to your lodge or hotel in the vicinity of Victoria Falls, in Zambia. This natural wonder of the world provides a fitting conclusion to your tour. There are plenty of activities on offer, some for the not so faint hearted!

## Day 16

Transfer back to Livingstone airport for your onward flight to Johannesburg, connecting with your return overnight flight to London Heathrow with South African Airways, arriving early the following morning.

## Day 1

Overnight flight from London Heathrow to Cape Town with South African Airways.

## Day 2-5

On arrival into Cape Town you will be met by your driver who will transfer you to your chosen hotel in Cape Town for a 4-night stay. The 'mother city' needs little introduction and is an appealing place to spend a few days, taking in the sights or just enjoying this charming and scenic city.

## Day 6-9

Today you will be transferred back to the airport for your onward 2-hour flight north to Windhoek in Namibia. Your 4-night visit will include an overnight in Windhoek and a 3-night DuneHopper experience, visiting the remote NamibRand Nature Reserve and Sossusvlei area. The Namib desert is the oldest in the world and the huge dunes and landscape are a sight to behold.
